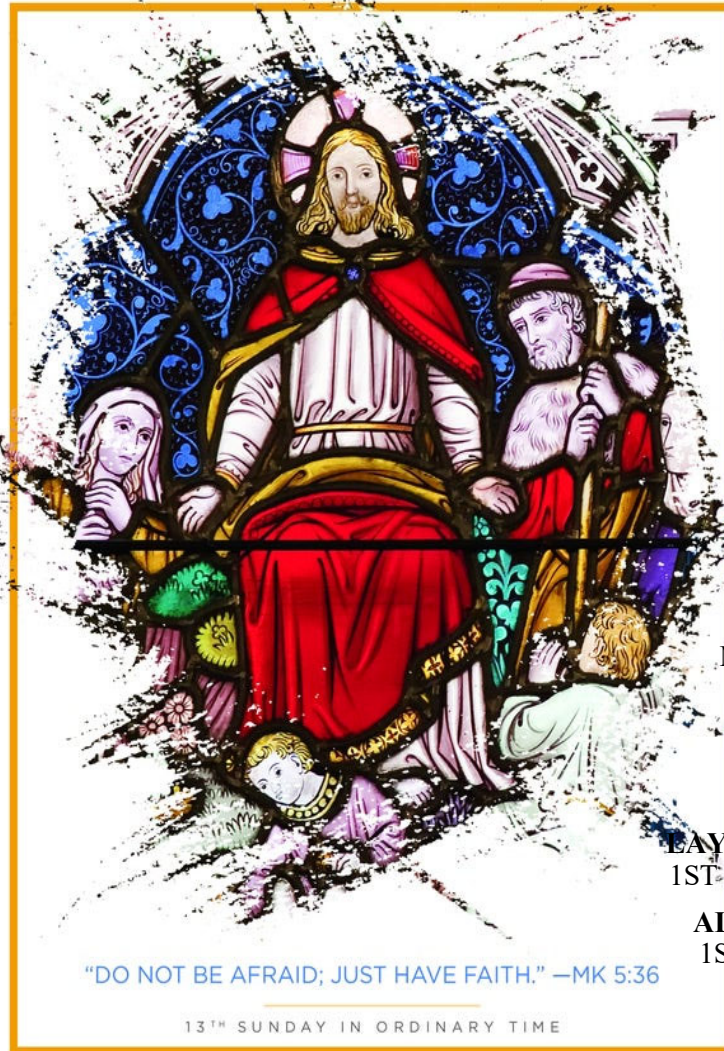

June ~ the Month of the Sacred Heart



Although this month is over, the devotion to the Sacred Heart should be kept amongst our prayers all year long. You've probably read them before, but let's review the magnificent promises of Our Lord to those devoted to His Heart! The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a devotion that began in the 12th century and became more popular after Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. In 1673, Margaret heard Jesus tell her that he wanted to show his love for people by encouraging a special devotion to his Sacred Heart.

The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is a moveable feast, meaning the exact date changes each year. This year, the solemnity fell on June 16, 2024. In 1675, Jesus told St. Margaret Mary that he wanted the feast of the Sacred Heart to be celebrated on the

Friday after the Corpus Christi octave. In 1856, the feast of the Sacred Heart became a universal feast.

St. John Paul II, who was deeply devoted to the Sacred Heart, said: *"This feast reminds us of the mystery of the love of God for the people of all times."*

Here are meaningful ways to celebrate a devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Display an image of the Sacred Heart.

Enthroned the Sacred Heart in your home. There is a growing revival of devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Many Catholics are enthroning an image of the Sacred Heart in their homes. This enthronement is a way of making visible a consecration to the Sacred Heart and is a powerful reminder of God's presence in every moment.

Pray to the Sacred Heart. Catholics pray in a special way this month for Christ's love and truth to spread throughout the world so that, someday, all the world will honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Many other prayers to the Sacred Heart are particularly meaningful this month. There are a number of beloved aspirations that can be said throughout the day to connect quickly with Christ: "Sacred Heart of Jesus, make my heart like yours." "Sacred Heart of Jesus, I trust in you." "Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, grant that I may love you more and more." "Sacred Heart of Jesus, I believe in your love for me." "Sacred Heart of Jesus, protect my family and have mercy on us."

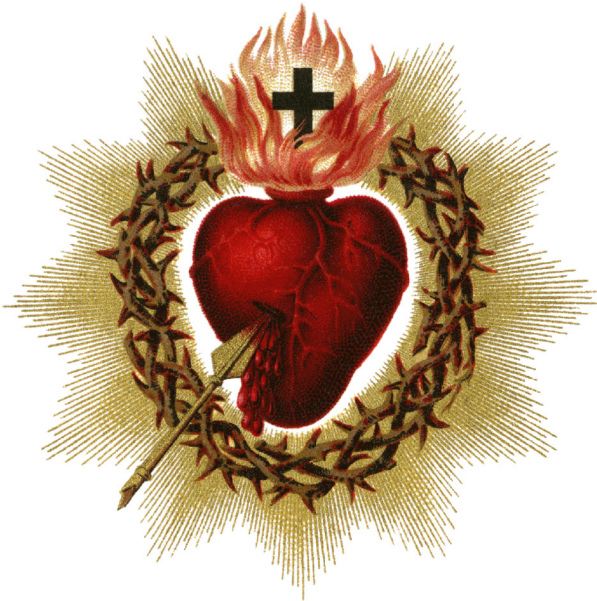
Seek out the Sacred Heart. A special visit or pilgrimage to a parish or chapel dedicated to the Sacred Heart is fitting this month. If there is a statue or image of the Sacred Heart at a church near you, bring flowers to lay before it, or bring loved ones there for prayer.

Share the love of Christ's Sacred Heart. Devotion to Jesus' Sacred Heart is a celebration of the reign of Christ's infinite love. Visiting Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament seems especially appropriate this month.



These twelve promises show us in no uncertain terms just how much Our Lord desires that we devote ourselves to His loving Heart.

For those who do, He promised:



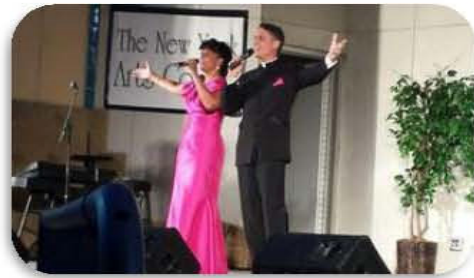
1. I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
2. I will establish peace in their homes.
3. I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
4. I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
5. I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
6. Sinners will find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
9. I will bless every place in which an image of my Heart is exposed and honored.
10. I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart.
12. I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

The twelfth promise refers to the First Friday devotion—a very easy way to insert devotion to the Sacred Heart into our monthly routines. All we have to do is receive Holy Communion on nine consecutive First Fridays (ensuring we go to Confession beforehand if we are not in a state of grace), offering these Communions in reparation for the sins committed against the Sacred Heart.

There are many other additional, daily ways to place ourselves in the Heart of Christ. A simple thought of love and affection means so much to Him. “Jesus, I trust in You!” or “Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!” are other little prayers we can offer to more firmly bind ourselves to this Heart that loves us so much.
